- 53% of its area is covered by agricultural activities or forests

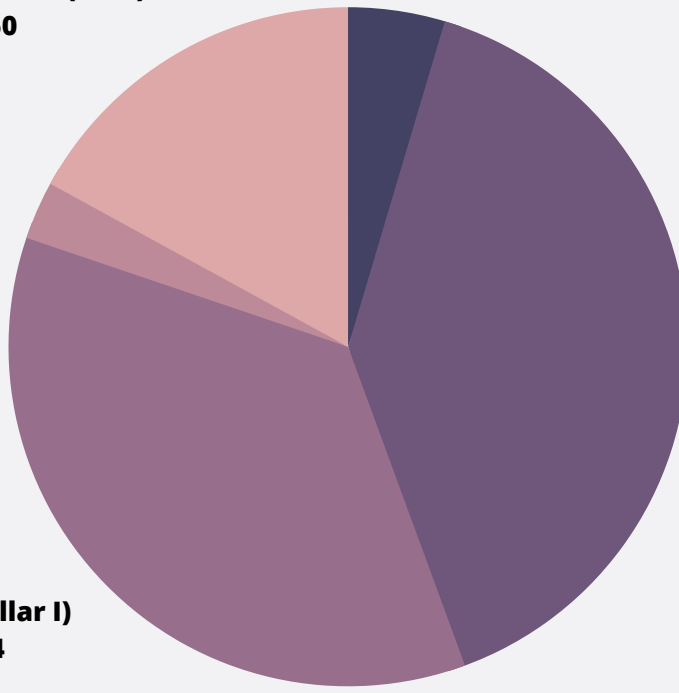

## Economics & Payments

### Promoting balanced land distribution

- Introduce a redistributive payment of €30/ha for the first 30 ha of the holding and €70/ha for areas of between 30 and 70 ha

## Greening

### Boosting sustainable practices in agriculture

- Supporting practices minimising GHG and ammonia emissions
- Increasing the area under organic farming to 20% by 2025
  - Reduce use of pesticides by 50% by 2030
- Reduce livestock density by at least 15% within the first three years
- €70/ha and €1,000/ha depending on the active substances and type of crops

## Social Dimension

- Support for 150 young farmers with starting financial aid €80,000
- Decrease the use of antimicrobials by 50% by 2030
- Livestock building only supported if conforming with organic measures

## Innovation

- Supporting the digitalisation of the agricultural sector

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
